- 6. What joins the flag and gun at the foot of the flagstaff as symbols of the revolution?(5)
- 7. What reason can you provide for Napoleon to turn around and advocate the windmill? Why would he go so far as to say that the windmill was *his* idea?(5)*
- 8. Why does Napoleon decide to engage in trade with neighbouring farms?(6)
- 9. Which original tenets (beliefs) of Animalism are violated by the pigs in chapter 6?
- 10. Which character would appear to be responsible for the propaganda on Animal Farm? Using your notes, determine which examples of propaganda you have seen so far in the story.
