Year at a Glance

The course will be divided into three equal terms with separate focus:

Term One - Non-Fiction Prose

Students will be exposed to the foundations of non-fiction composition, and will have a chance to demonstrate their understanding through a topic of personal interest.

Term Two - Poetry

Students will learn various poetic forms and devices, while exploring various themes and modes for creatively presenting poetic work.

Term Three - Prose Fiction

Students will learn various narrative forms and devices, while working individually and collaboratively to tell engaging, interactive, and personal stories.

Fundamentals in grammar, usage, and vocabulary will also be covered at various times in the year.

Assessment Breakdown by Term:

Portfolio	 Amount of original writing submitted and/ or the quality of original writing submitted
Process	 Evidence of understanding and adherence to the stages of the writing process (brainstorming, outlining, drafting, editing/ proofreading, final copy)
Research	 Evidence of research devoted to chosen topics or writing in general. Both assigned and independent research will be included
Analysis	 Ability to deconstruct writing for the purpose of understanding the relationship between form and function in a written work
Reflection	 Evidence of personal reflection and growth when considering interests and abilities as a writer.

NOTE: Not all aspects may be present every term, nor may they be weighed evenly or consistently. Specific criteria and breakdowns will be presented at the beginning of each term.

Supplies

Personal technology such as smartphones, tablets, or computers ARE NOT REQUIRED for daily use in my classroom. In my experiences working with students, personal technology is a distraction far more often than it is an aid, and in numerous examples has added to academic difficulties throughout the school year.

Expectations

Be prepared to learn, be on time, be respectful

Simply put, students are expected to conduct themselves responsibly and respectfully at all times. **Students** are responsible for their own actions, attendance, and grades, and will be held accountable for these responsibilities. Assignments

Please see your school handbook in your app, or visit the school website, for SDSS's policy on plagiarism. Taking credit for an assignment or piece of writing that is not your own is called plagiarism, and it is a very serious offence. While students are encouraged to ask for help or clarification from sources outside the classroom, ultimately it is the student's own ideas, words, and efforts that should be evaluated and celebrated. In the event of a plagiarized assignment being submitted, the work shall receive a mark of zero, and parents and administration will be contacted.

It is expected that assignments will be submitted **on time**. If you think you will be unable to submit an assignment on time, you must see me before the due date to discuss.

Late assignments will be marked at my discretion; students wishing for me to mark late work sooner will need to schedule an appointment during Flex Time to conference with me.

Ultimately, the best way you develop as a student is by submitting assignments and receiving feedback in a timely fashion; a late submission prevents you from receiving the knowledge you need to improve.

Incomplete Assignments: Students who do not complete assignments reflecting prescribed learning outcomes run the risk of not receiving a 1^{st} or 2^{nd} term mark, or not successfully passing the year.
