Year at a Glance

The focus in this English 8 course is the power of story and storytelling, and an exploration of how this medium reveals an understanding of ourselves and our worlds.

A final assessment for the year will be assigned in May/ June. This assessment will be worth 10% of the overall course mark.

Language and Learning

Students will review the fundamental mechanics and structures of English and explore their interests through an individual reading project.

Novel Study

Students will be introduced to literary elements and the “Hero’s Journey” with the novel, *The Last Book in the Universe*. Focus will be on reinforcing literacy and comprehension, understanding of the importance of setting in literary work, and practicing formal writing responses.

Short Stories

Students will continue to develop understanding of various literary elements and explore how those elements contribute to a theme or message in a text. Writing skills will continue to be developed.

Mythology

Students will study select texts for the purpose of understanding how stories can be used to teach, explain, and unite the larger world and its peoples. Focus for this unit will be on character and characterization

World Building/ RPG

The last unit of the year will combine many of the skills and concepts learned to date in order for students to collaboratively build a world that can serve as backdrop to personalized interactive stories in the form of roleplaying games.

NOTE: This unit may include final assessment components for the course.

Assessments

Course assessments will come in the form of comprehension questions, paragraph and essay responses, tests and quizzes, and group and individual projects and presentations.

Supplies

Binder, paper, pens, pencils, highlighters, usb or flash memory

*** Supplies for creating visuals, posters, and 3D models may be required

Personal technology such as smartphones, tablets, or computers ARE NOT REQUIRED for daily use in my classroom. Students and parents are strongly encouraged to have a discussion of appropriate use of technology at school, and whether or not personal technology is needed in the classroom. In my experiences working with students, personal technology is a distraction far more often than it is an aid, and in numerous examples has added to academic difficulties throughout the school year.

Expectations
